She also received a Certification in Long Term Post Sub Acute Care in Administration from Iona College in New Rochelle.

Mrs. Richards is the Director of Nursing at Henry J. Carter Specialty Hospital and Nursing Facility. She is well respected and admired by many in the facility, and seen as a role model for other nurses. Mrs. Richards has a strong history of giving back to the community. In addition to her responsibilities as a Director of Nursing, she continues to lead and inspire others.

Stanlee's leadership and ability to organize a diverse and dedicated group of Coler-Goldwater staff of volunteers to consistently exceed annual fund raising goals for the American Cancer Society, fight against Breast Cancer.

Mrs. Richards has received many awards. The most recent one was presented on May 8, 2013, which was the Sloan Public Service Award, presented by the Fund for the City of New York. The award is regarded as the Noble Prize of City Government. Mrs. Richards has dedicated 45 years to advocating and caring for patients. She also received the Presidential Citation Award from the Nurse Association of the Counties of Long Island, Inc. on November 14, 2014

Other awards received, Outstanding Service Award from Wheel Chair Charities 2012, SMHN Leadership Award 2011, from Coler-Goldwater Administration, Marguerite Creth Jackson Sister Hood Award 2009 from Chi Eta Phi Sorority, Inc., and many awards from the Department of the Army, the Army Commendation Medal 2002, and The Army Achievement Medal 2004.
